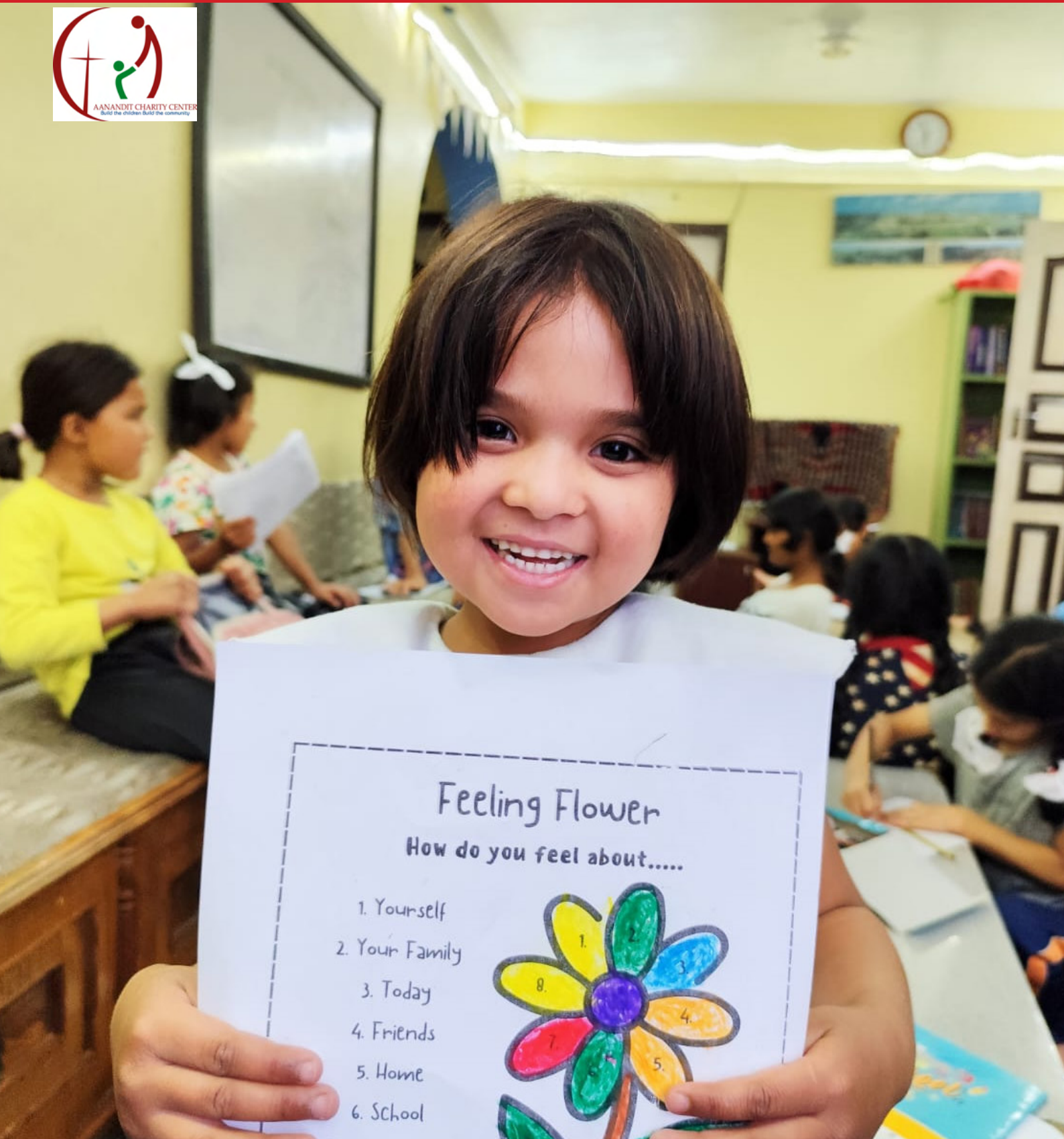

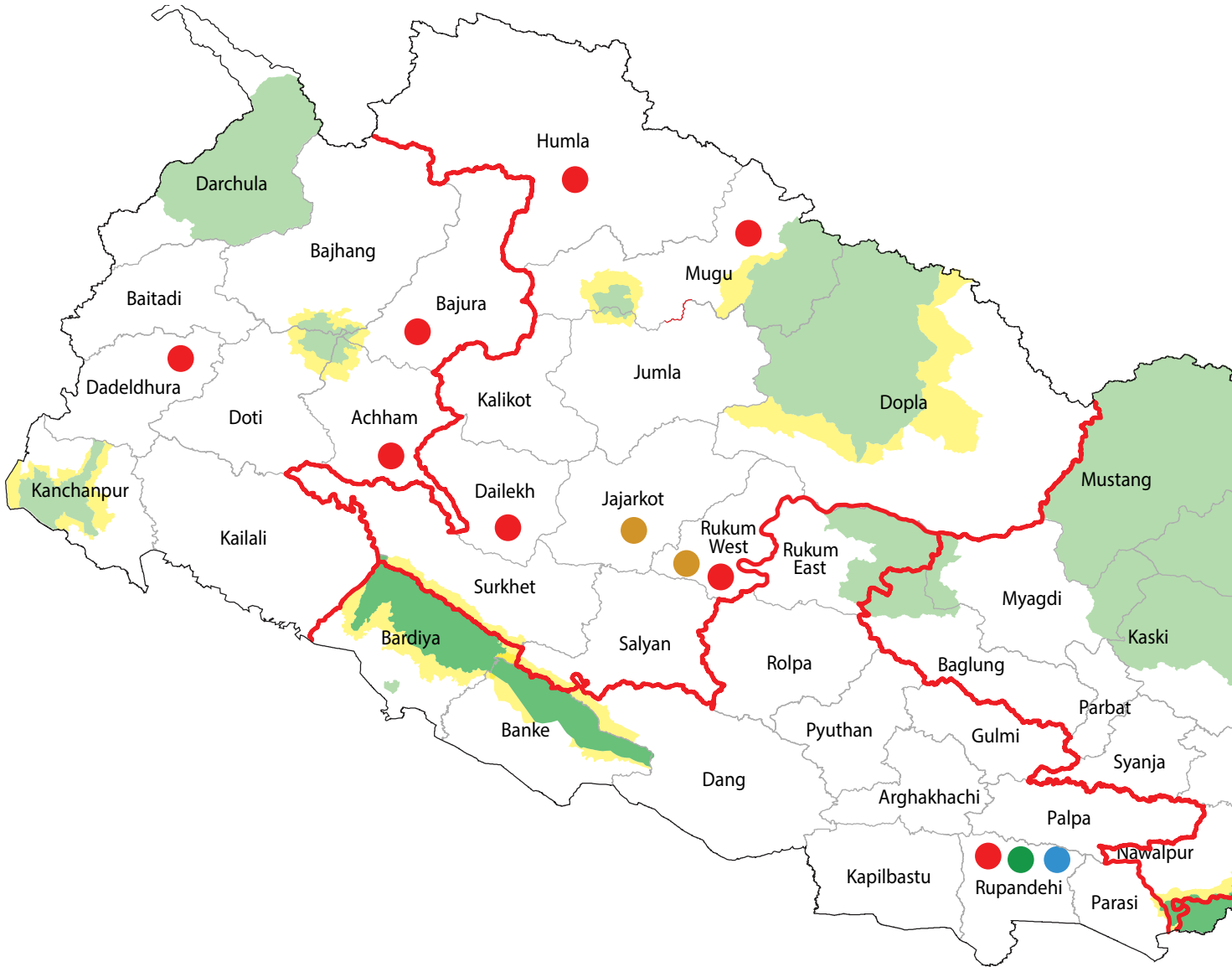

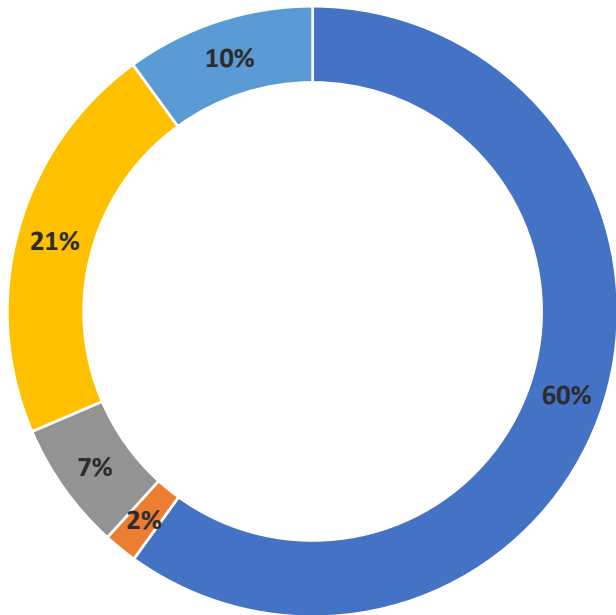
As Scripture reminds us, "Not one promise from God is empty of power" (Luke 1:35 TPT).

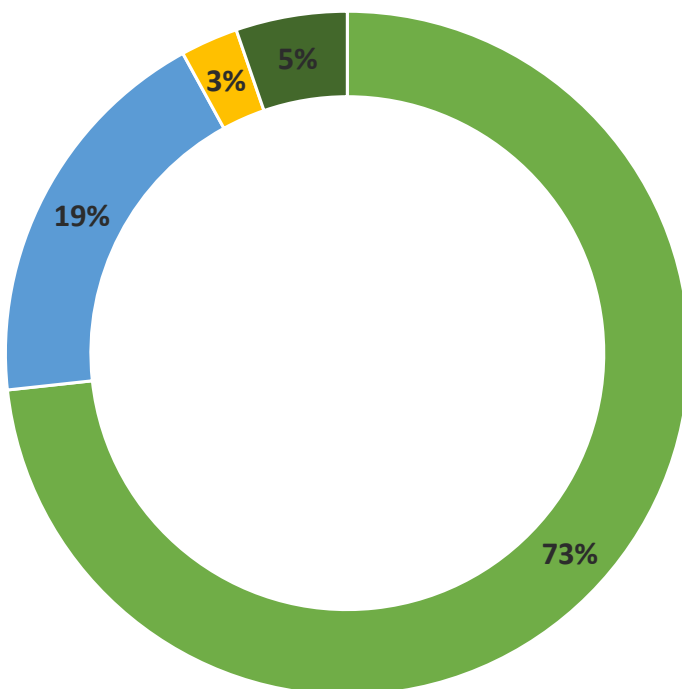

Dikshya (Mina Kumari) Tamang comes from Sindhupalchok whose father died while she and her siblings were quite young. Mother remarried and left them before their father passed away. Dikshya has been living in various places in search of love and care. The last home she stayed kicked her out in the middle of the night accusing her of stealing. She is beautiful and smart girl. She helps younger girls at home and is very active at her school. She wants to be in the army when she grows. Her hard work, peaceful spirit and beautiful smile lights up our Home. She is one of the many girls in our home who have painful background but their present and future is secure with us.



Welcome Ranjita, Anjali and Ganga:



Ranjita Thapa comes from Sindhupalchowk and faced a very challenging early life in a family affected by alcohol and domestic violence. She has two siblings, and the loss of her father to suicide left the family in deep pain and poverty. On the recommendation of the local municipality, Ranjita is now part of the ACC Home. We are privileged to care for her and support her as she grows to reach her full potential. She has a strong and resilient spirit, and we are confident she will achieve great things.



We recently welcomed Ganga and her sister Anjali from the Far West region of Nepal. Their father struggled with mental illness and passed away, and their mother, living in a very remote area and facing extreme financial hardship, made the decision to send them to ACC Home so they could have the care and education they deserve. We feel so privileged to nurture them. These two girls are wise beyond their years, full of curiosity and warmth, and we can't wait to see all that they will achieve.



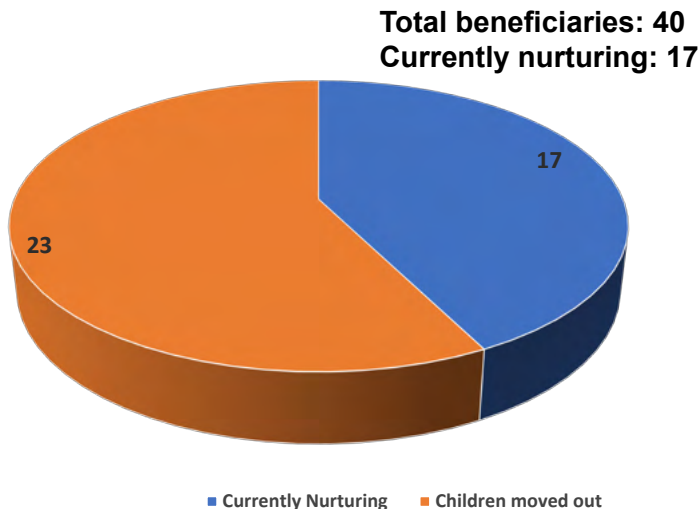

Aanandit Girl's Hostel

Empowering the next generation: Aanandit Educational Sector...



Sapana Pariyar has been in a journey filled with silence, struggle, and strength. From a very young age, life tested her in difficult way those people can't imagine. Both of her parents are deaf and mute, and because of extremely poor financial condition, her uncle took her in an orphanage when she was just three years old. She lived there for years, believing that her parents had died.

She spent most of her childhood feeling like she had no one. She studied there up to class 8. After that, due to some difficult issues within the hostel, she had to leave and return to her own village.

Continuing her education in the village was extremely difficult. She had to walk more than an hour every day just to reach school because

they had no money for transportation. Many days, she studied on an empty stomach because they didn't have enough food.

There was no electricity at home, so she would go to her neighbour's house just to read at night. The hardest part wasn't just the lack of money. It was the fear and emotional trauma. At home, she never felt truly safe. Some relatives who tried to take advantage of her. It was a frightening and dark time in her life. She was hopeless, and thought there was no reason to go on. One day, she took an entire bottle of medicine, hoping to end her life. But instead of dying, she fell asleep and had a powerful dream. In that dream, she saw something that felt unreal at the time: she was standing with her parents inside the church and they're praying. When she woke up, she was shocked- her body had no reaction to the medicine. Not even a headache.



From that day, she realized something: she had been saved for a reason. She was chosen by God for something greater. So, she went to her neighbours who were believers and asked them to take her church. From that moment, she started to believe. After believing, slowly her heart began to heal. Now, she is continuing her education with new hope and vision. Her dream is to go abroad in the future, work hard, and become a successful, independent person.

She wants to give her parents the life they never had. They have lived in silence, poverty, and pain for too long. She wants to be the reason they smile without worry.

Her dreams don't stop there. She wants to help other children and youth who are like her. She wants to inspire girls who are abused, ignored, or left behind by society. She said, ***"I am not ashamed of my story. Every scar has made me stronger"***.

Sapana joined ACC Hostel in May 2025. She is very thankful for the support she has here.



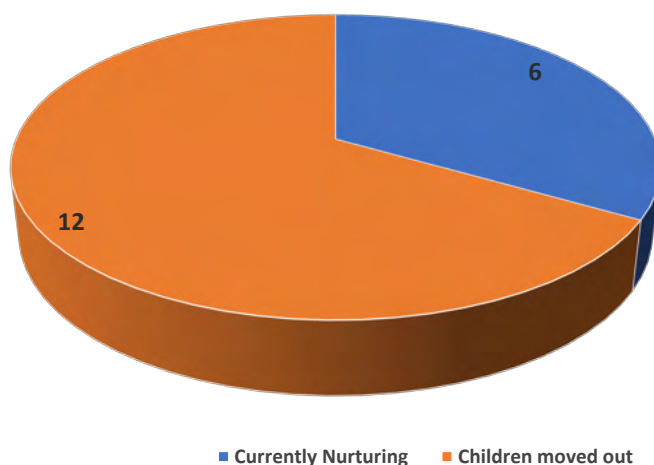
Hope Restored

Anjali Gurung, a 16-year-old girl, has joined the ACC hostel to continue her studies and pursue a brighter future in a safe and supportive environment. She lost both her parents in a bus accident when she was just four years old and has limited use of the left side of her body, functioning at only 40%. She was cared for by her maternal grandparents, who are very poor and unable to keep her in school consistently. Because of these interruptions, Anjali is still at the lower secondary level, but she is now happy to have the opportunity to study regularly and live in the well-designed ACC facility. We are thankful to God for her life and the hope of a brighter future.

We provide accommodation, safe environment, housing, educational support. We also ensure their emotional health and provide career guidance through our time-to-time counselling and guidance.

Scholarship: Educational Pathways



Sayesh Tamang : A 18 years young man has finished his College with good grade. He comes from a family whose father had leprosy and various health issues. He passed away leaving the family in hug debt. His mother was left with two young children and hug debt. By our support he and his sister have been able to receive education. Sayesh has recently passed grade 12 and now ready for his bachelor degree. He was longing to go aboard at young age but our encouragement has helped him to stay with his mom and study here further. We are so proud to see this family progress and find hope in the midst of despair.

He and his sister are just examples of many other children who have helped by our scholarship program.

Aanandit Charity Center aligns closely with the national priorities through its scholarship program. This program identifies and supports children from disadvantaged backgrounds, providing not only financial assistance but also counselling and empowerment in partnership with their local schools.

Srijana Dahal, a 18 years old is from Sindhuli whom we visited first three years ago.

Her father, Chanda Prasad Dahal, and mother, Sarada Dahal, both were suffering from mental health for 24 and 12 years. Since then, they have been on medication. Her mother couldn't communicate, and her father couldn't work. Her brother Tanka Prasad Dahal, who is 19 years old, also couldn't move both his legs below the knee since birth.

Her grandfather used to support her studies and look after the whole family with his old-age allowance.



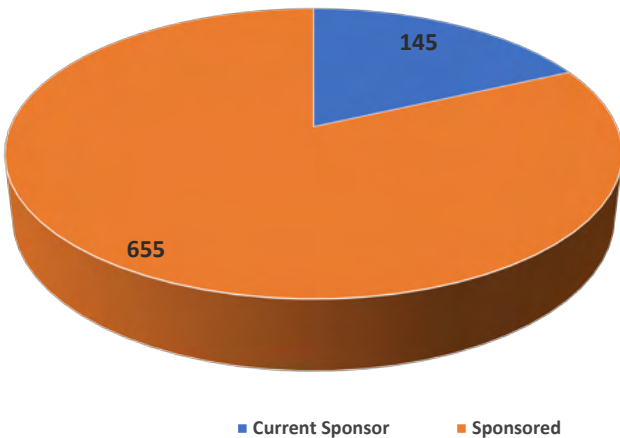
Improvements:

Over the past four years, the support provided by Aanandit Charity Centre has brought significant change to Srijana's life. This assistance has made it easier for her to access the essential materials needed for her studies and continue her education with confidence.

We visited Srijana in May 2025 and learned that she is doing very well academically. She has shown remarkable improvement and successfully passed Grade 12. She now plans to pursue a bachelor's degree in the Faculty of Education.

Srijana shared that, while growing up, she dreamed of earning an income to support the medical treatment of her father, mother, and brother. Today, she is hopeful and optimistic about her future. She expressed deep gratitude for the love and support she has received, and our recent visit further encouraged and inspired her to pursue her goals with renewed excitement.

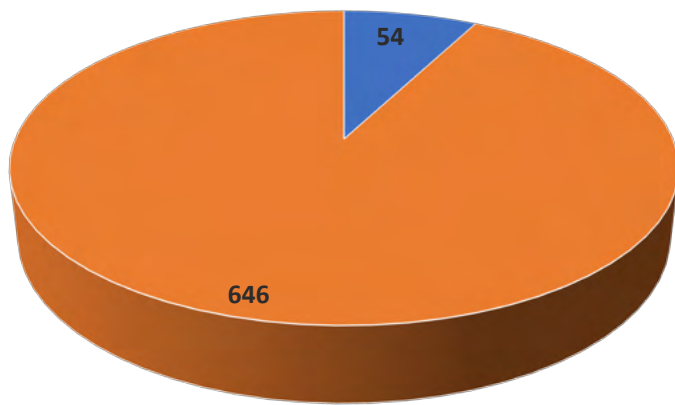

Aanandit Day Care provides a safe and nurturing space for toddlers from financially vulnerable families, especially children of single mothers who must work in construction, domestic labor, or street jobs. Our care allows parents to work with peace of mind, knowing their children are safe and well cared for.



Prasant Khadka from eastern Nepal joined our program after his mother fled domestic violence and moved to Kathmandu for work. When he arrived, he was weak and mentally disturbed. Today, he is healthy, active, and sociable, and his mother can work regularly to support her family. With tears in her eyes, she said, ***“I don’t know how I would have fed my son without ACC’s care. Thank you for being my guardian.”***

This initiative also aligns with Nepal’s 16th Five-Year Plan and national policies that prioritize the protection, care, and early childhood development of women and children, promote gender equality, and expand social protection for vulnerable families. Our day care directly supports these goals by strengthening early childhood care and enabling women’s economic participation.

1. Youth Empowerment Project

The **Youth Empowerment Program** was created to equip young people, especially those from disabled, orphaned, and economically disadvantaged families, with practical skills to achieve financial independence. In Nepal, many youth dream of going abroad for work due to limited local employment opportunities. By providing skill training and support, ACC empowers youth to build successful lives at home, reducing the need for risky foreign employment.



Youth Empowerment in Action

In 2025, Aanandit Charity Centre supported 20 youth with practical skills training, helping them access meaningful work locally. Each year, hundreds of thousands of Nepali youths go abroad for employment. Approximately 700,000 left in recent fiscal years, highlighting the urgent need for domestic skill development.

Our support extends beyond training. We provide seed funding and mentoring to help youth launch their own small businesses. Already, five young people have successfully started their own ventures, becoming examples of courage and perseverance in their communities.



One inspiring example is Bhim Tamang, a differently-abled young man from Sindhupalchok who has been supported by ACC since Grade 2. After completing college and mobile repair training, Bhim used a youth empowerment loan to open his own mobile repair shop in Banepa. He has trained his brother and plans to expand his business to help other differently-abled youth gain skills and income.

Bhim shares, “I never thought I could run my own business. Now I can support my parents and even help others learn the same skills.”



This initiative aligns with Nepal’s 16th Five-Year Plan, which prioritizes inclusive employment, skill development, and entrepreneurship for marginalized youth through collaboration across government, private, and non-government sectors.

Suraj Magar and Sunita Gole: A Success Story



Sunita Gole, born in Makawanpur, grew up in a poor family. Her mother left, and her father works as a farmer. Through the Youth Empowerment Program, Sunita received Barista training and used her skills to start a café with two partners, achieving an average daily sale of 150 pounds.

Sunita now thrives in business along side her newly married husband, Suraj, under the mentorship of Ps. Nar Bahadur. Her story inspires young women who might otherwise consider going



abroad and risking exploitation. Sunita demonstrates that with the right skills, success is possible in Nepal.

Looking Ahead

In 2026, Aanandit Charity Centre plans to support 20 more youth with skills training, creating local opportunities and reducing reliance on foreign employment.

2. Micro Business Support:

The Micro Business Support (MBS) project, an initiative of Aanandit Charity Centre (ACC), aims to empower financially disadvantaged individuals by providing seed capital to start or expand small-scale income-generating activities. In the reporting year, ACC supported a total of over 1200 supports, enabling families to either launch new businesses or sustain and grow existing enterprises.



This support has allowed beneficiaries to increase household income, generate employment opportunities, utilize underused resources such as land, and improve financial management skills.

Project Activities



The MBS project aligns with the Government of Nepal's poverty reduction and economic development strategies. Applicants undergo an interview process to assess financial need and determine eligibility. Most supports are directed toward the agriculture sector, while recipients are encouraged to save and reinvest in their businesses.

Thulimaya Ghale from Bhardew, South Lalitpur, is a new Micro Business Borrower and a new believer in Christ. Despite her husband being paralyzed for six years, she has started a small goat farm with a soft loan from the Micro Business Support Program of Aanandit Charity. She is raising goats and a calf buffalo, and have made significant income during Dashain Festival.

2. Vocational Training : Empowering Women

The Anandit Tailoring Project began with a simple but powerful vision: to give women the skills to create, earn, and restore hope. Since 2018, more than 200 women have been empowered through basic and advanced tailoring training. Many have gone on to open their own small shops, work in garment factories, or sew from home while caring for their families.

Through these skills, women bring income into their households, serve their communities with dignity, and rediscover their sense of purpose. The project also produces handcrafted gift items made from traditional Nepali Dhaka fabric, loved by supporters in Nepal and abroad. Income from these creations helps sustain the program and creates meaningful employment for women within Anandit, turning skill into livelihood and hope into lasting change.

Sangita (Thulimaya) Pariyar

She comes from Chandranigapur, outside Kathmandu, and grew up in an extremely poor family. Her father passed away when she was very young, and she was raised by her mother alone. Despite the challenges, she completed her schooling and came to Kathmandu for further studies. However, she could not afford college education. With her sister's help, she found a job in a garment factory, which allowed her to continue her studies while supporting herself.



She later connected with ACC for advanced training and was supported to start her own tailoring shop. ACC has also funded her advanced fashion designing course to further empower her skills and career. Today, she is gradually growing her boutique and trains other needy women, sharing her skills to empower others.

Words from ACC Partners

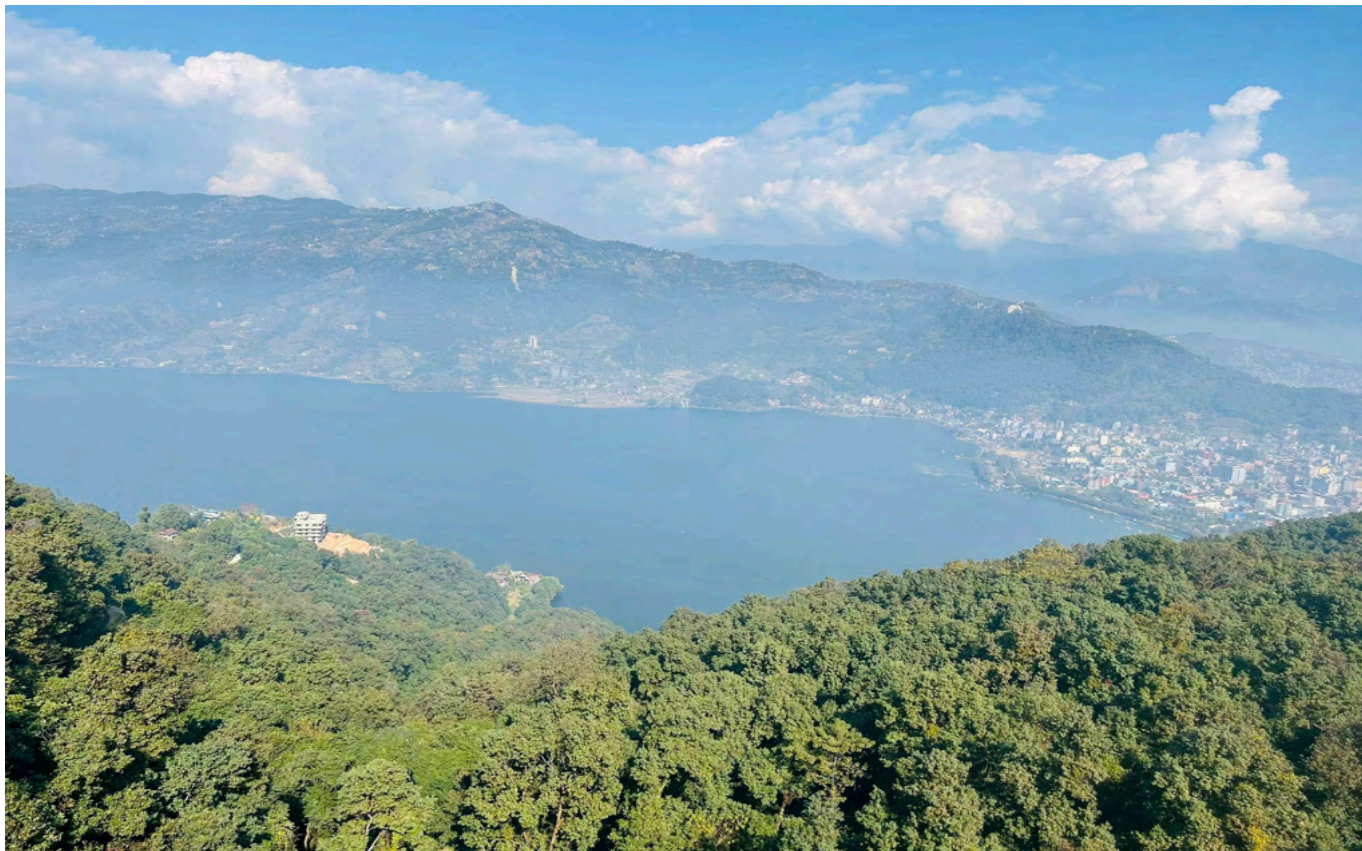
